Dr. Krishna Pagilla, UNR, presented information on UNR's role in the study. He reviewed the Advanced Water Treatment Technologies Demonstration Project Scope of Work which includes: Project Rationale and Justification; Treatment Technologies Evaluations; Basis of Design - Demonstration Projects; and Operating and Testing Plan.

Mr. Warner summarized next steps and ongoing collaborations. Mr. Warner and Dr. Pagilla also answered questions from Commissioners.



Information System ("GIS") Map project, and possible direction to staff.

#### **SUMMARY**

Truckee Meadows Regional Planning Agency ("TMRPA") staff has completed data gathering and assessment tasks in the Regional Storm Water Drainage Network Geographic Information System ("GIS") Map project, Phase 1 scope of work. Phase 1 includes the following tasks:

- Compile existing storm water network GIS data received from local jurisdictions and store in a centralized database.
- Evaluate GIS data for completeness of coverage.
- Evaluate attribute data included with the GIS features.
- Prepare a final report and provide a presentation to the Western Regional Water Commission ("WRWC"), Regional Planning Governing Board and Northern Nevada Water Planning Commission ("NNWPC").
- Make the final collection of GIS data available to interested government entities.

TMRPA used visual and quantitative assessment techniques to analyze GIS storm water conveyance infrastructure data provided by the local jurisdictions. Jeremy Smith of TMRPA will provide a PowerPoint presentation on data compilation and analysis, initial conclusions, remaining Phase 1 work, and possible next steps for continuation of the project.

#### BACKGROUND

In March 2017, the WRWC requested staff to work with TMRPA staff and present a proposal to the NNWPC for the development of a regional storm water GIS map. In April 2017, the NNWPC recommended that the WRWC approve TMRPA's proposal for the GIS map project. The WRWC approved a motion directing staff to move forward with Phase 1 of the proposed project at a cost not to exceed \$21,000 from the Regional Water Management Fund, and after completion return with recommendations for subsequent phases.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the NNWPC accept the report on Phase 1 of the subject GIS Map project, and provide appropriate direction to staff if desired.

#### **SUMMARY**

In April 2016, the Regional Effluent Management Team (the "Team") presented a report on the development of a phased feasibility program to demonstrate treatment technologies and evaluate whether advanced treatment of effluent and groundwater replenishment offers long-term regional benefits. Program elements include community outreach, State regulatory framework, treatment technology, pilot testing, hydrologic investigations and field-scale demonstration projects.

Implementation of the feasibility program is underway and the Team has determined that consultant assistance concerning communication and outreach is required in the very near future. Data Instincts Public Outreach Consultants is uniquely qualified because of its extensive experience with similar efforts in California and other states. In addition, the firm's principal, Mr. Mark Milan, is a member of the Water Research Foundation, Independent Advisory Panel, which is advising and assisting the Team and other local agency staff to implement the various phases of the feasibility program.

The attached scope of work is intended to provide for timely initiation of the first phase of assistance, and will be followed by a more robust proposal to be considered by the NNWPC for possible recommendation to the Western Regional Water Commission ("WRWC") for inclusion in the FY 2018-2019 budget.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Team, consisting of technical staff from the City of Reno, the City of Sparks, Washoe County and the Truckee Meadows Water Authority, has been meeting since April 2014 to discuss regional effluent management issues. In 2016, the development and initiation of the feasibility program marked a significant step forward in regional effluent management. Since then, staff and Team members have provided reports from time to time to keep the NNWPC

apprised of progress and to request funding for feasibility program activities such as the Advanced Water Treatment Technologies Demonstration project, currently underway at UNR.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

If approved, the fiscal impact to the RWMF will be \$25,000. Adequate budget authority exists in the Fiscal Year 2017–2018 budget, located in Fund Group 766, Fund 7066, Account Number 710100, Professional Services, Cost Object WP310200.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the NNWPC approve the proposed scope of work and funding, in an amount not to exceed \$25,000, from the RWMF; authorize the Program Manager to execute an Agreement with Data Instincts for that purpose; and provide further direction to staff, as appropriate.

The consultant will provide guidance and assistance in:

- Assist with developing outreach material and PowerPoints
- Developing outreach messages and public awareness strategies for responding to and informing the public
- Provide assistance and guidance in best practices for public awareness, methods of disseminating information, and education strategies to minimize misinformation
- Establishing the Commission and its member agencies as the reliable source of information regarding the Feasibility Study
- Listening to stakeholders concerns and assisting with appropriate responses
- Providing graphic and informational support
- Provide knowledge, research pertinent data, draft concepts, suggest strategies, and outreach mediums as may be needed to respond to inquiries and concerns

As warranted the Consultant shall develop communications materials and cost estimates for considered outreach approaches in coordination with staff on an as needed basis. These may involve a variety of collateral materials such as fact sheets, PowerPoint presentations, informational updates, educational materials, guidelines, letters, and email broadcasts. In such instances, additional estimates will be provided.
